The P-Card Code: Repair parts

When completing your P-Card reconciliation or expense corrections, please remember the expenditure type "Repair Parts" can only be applied to a Repairs project number (example: 0110 and 0216). Please use another expenditure type if you are trying to charge to your normal project numbers.

If you do not have a Repairs project number set up, please contact Accounts Payable to set up an exception. Also, please be sure to double check your task number to ensure it is accurate so your expenses are entered into the system correctly. If you are not aware of your project number or task number, please contact your Regional Business Analyst (RBA).
